RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY OF CHESTER

Resolution of the County of Chester, authorizing the filing of a proposal for funds with the Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED), Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

WHEREAS, the Homeless Emergency Assistance and Rapid Transition to Housing Act of 2009 (HEARTH) enacted into law on May 20, 2009, authorized the Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) Program; and

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania through the Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED) has received ESG program funds and is making these funds available to units of local governments for eligible emergency shelter activities; and

WHEREAS, the County of Chester desires to submit an application to DCED for ESG Program funds on behalf of the rapid re-housing homeless shelter and service providers.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County of Chester that:

1. This proposed Emergency Solutions Grant application from the County of Chester to be funded by a grant from the Pennsylvania ESG Program are hereby eligible and approved.
2. The Chester Department of Community Development on behalf of the Board of Commissioners of the County of Chester is authorized and directed to execute an ESG Program application in the amount of \$400,000.00 to the PA Department of Community and Economic Development.
3. The County of Chester will assume the responsibility for securing the required matching amount of project funds.
4. The County of Chester will reimburse the Commonwealth for any expenditure found to be ineligible.
5. The County of Chester is authorized to provide such assurances, certificates, and supplemental data or revised data that DCED may request in connection with the application.

THE CHESTER COUNTY INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

RESOLUTION
Adopted July 15, 2015

AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE ISSUANCE OF THE AUTHORITY'S LIMITED OBLIGATION NOTE IN AN AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$408,000; APPROVING THE FORM AND EXECUTION OF CERTAIN FINANCING DOCUMENTS RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF THE NOTE; AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF THE NOTE; APPOINTING BOND COUNSEL; AUTHORIZING INCIDENTAL ACTIONS; AND REPEALING INCONSISTENT RESOLUTIONS.

WHEREAS, the Chester County Industrial Development Authority (the "Authority") is a body corporate and politic organized and existing under the Pennsylvania Economic Development Financing Law (Act of August 23, 1967, P.L. 251, as amended and supplemented) (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority proposes to issue its Limited Obligation Note in an aggregate principal amount of \$ 408,000 (the "Note") to evidence a loan in the same amount from **Fulton Bank** (the "Bank") pursuant to a commitment letter of the Bank dated **May 21, 2015** (the "Commitment"), the proceeds of which shall be used by **Melvin P. and Sadie F. Stoltzfus** (the "Farmer") to finance the costs (including issuance costs) of a project consisting of the acquisition of farmland and equipment for use in farming operations thereon (the "Project") pursuant to the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture's Next Generation Farmer Loan Program; and

WHEREAS, in connection with issuance of the Note the Authority will be required to execute and deliver certain documents and instruments including, but not limited to, the Note, and related documents and certificates; and

WHEREAS, certain action is required to be taken by the Authority as a prerequisite to the issuance and sale of the Note;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Chester County Industrial Development Authority:

SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF ISSUANCE OF THE NOTE. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of the Note for the purposes set forth above. The Note shall mature, bear interest and be secured as described in the Commitment. It is the intent of the Authority that the costs of the Project will be financed through the issuance of the Note. **It is the further intent of the Authority that the proceeds of the Note may be used to reimburse the Farmer for certain costs of the Project incurred within the previous 60-day period and for certain costs incurred prior to issuance of the Note.**

The form of the Note presented to the Board of the Authority is hereby approved, with such changes, insertions and variations as are necessary or appropriate to reflect the final terms of the Note and such other changes as the Chairman or Vice Chairman may approve upon advice of counsel to the Authority, such approval to be evidenced by the execution by the Authority of the Indenture; and the execution of the Note by the genuine or facsimile signatures of the Chairman or Vice Chairman and the Secretary or Assistant Secretary is hereby authorized and the corporate seal of the Authority (or a facsimile thereof) is hereby authorized to be affixed or imprinted thereon; and the Chairman or Vice Chairman is hereby authorized and directed to deliver the Note to the Bank.

SECTION 2. APPOINTMENT OF BOND COUNSEL. The law firm of Kegel Kelin Almy & Lord, LLP, Lancaster, Pennsylvania, is hereby appointed to serve as Bond Counsel for the Note.

SECTION 3. COVENANT TO MAINTAIN TAX EXEMPT STATUS OF BONDS. The Authority covenants to not do or fail to do anything to cause the Note to lose their tax exempt status under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

SECTION 4. INCIDENTAL ACTION. The officers of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver such other documents and instruments and to take or approve the taking of such action as may be necessary or appropriate in order to effectuate the execution and delivery of the Note and the financing of the Project, and to obtain the approval required under Pennsylvania's Economic Development Financing Law (Act of August 23, 1967, P.L. 251, as amended).


SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE; REPEAL. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption, and all prior resolutions or parts thereof inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 6: The issuance of the Note is contingent upon the Authority obtaining all necessary and appropriate approvals.

AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF AN AMENDMENT TO EASEMENT AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN
RICHARD A. VERMEIL AND CAROLYN D. VERMEIL QUALIFIED PERSONAL RESIDENCE TRUST
(GRANTORS), AND THE COUNTY OF CHESTER, PENNSYLVANIA (GRANTEE), AND WITH
VERMEIL TOWER (GRANTEE).**

WHEREAS, the County of Chester, through its Department of Emergency Services, has engaged in a County-wide upgrade of its public safety radio communication system; and

WHEREAS, as part of that process, placement and collocation of communications fixtures and related equipment upon existing tower sites is necessary to assure the efficacy of the system; and

WHEREAS, the County has previously entered into a Tower and Ground Space Sublease dated January 8, 2015 proportionately affecting Grantors' premises which is to be included as a site in Grantee County's public safety radio system; and

WHEREAS, on February 24, 2015, the East Fallowfield Township Board of Supervisors granted conditional use approval permitting the Grantee County to co-locate on the tower site and also required certain tree and other plantings as well as vegetation maintenance to be conducted and further required the installation of storm water controls as part of the land use approval process; and

WHEREAS, on April 27, 2015, the Grantee and Grantor entered an Easement Agreement; and

WHEREAS, to further effectuate and authorize the aforementioned activities, an Amendment to Easement Agreement must be entered into and executed between and among the parties identified above and as more specifically set forth in the Amendment to Easement Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Chester County Commissioners hereby authorize the execution of the Amendment to Easement Agreement in furtherance of the County's public safety radio system upgrade project.

**RESOLUTION OF THE CHESTER COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AUTHORIZING
HOMELAND SECURITY GRANT PROGRAM DOCUMENT EXECUTION BY
DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY SERVICES OR DESIGNEE**

WHEREAS, this Resolution is enacted pursuant to the authority of the County Code as applied to Third Class Counties, specifically Section 509, which permits the Board of Commissioners to adopt Resolutions prescribing the manner in which the powers of the County shall be carried out and in regulating the affairs of the County; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners, pursuant to the authority provided under the County Code, specifically 16 P.S. 1701 and 1801, are vested with and otherwise are responsible for the management and administration of County fiscal affairs and are the sole contractors for the County; and

WHEREAS, the Chester County Commissioners, on September 23, 2009, entered into a Mutual Aid and Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement with Bucks, Delaware, Montgomery, and Philadelphia Counties creating the Southeastern Pennsylvania Regional Task Force and an Executive Board; and

WHEREAS, the Southeastern Pennsylvania Regional Task Force is governed by an executive Board consisting of the County Emergency Management Coordinator from each of the Political Subdivisions; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Emergency Services is the Chester County Emergency Management Coordinator and as such is a member of the executive board; and

within the Southeastern Pennsylvania Regional Task Force is the execution of various agreements, contracts, and other administrative, legal, and financial documents; and

WHEREAS, given the anticipated significant number of these agreements which will require formal County execution, the Commissioners hereby delegate signatory authority on these agreements, contracts, and documents, which will streamline the time constraints if each was placed on a Commissioner's Agenda; and

WHEREAS, this delegation of authority is hereby vested in the Director of Emergency Services and, in his absence, the Deputy Director for Emergency Management, subject however, to review by the Solicitor.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Commissioners of the County of Chester hereby authorize the delegation of signatory authority of those agreements, contracts, and documents as set forth herein to the Director of Emergency Services and Deputy Director for Emergency Management. This Resolution is to become effective immediately upon execution by the Chester County Commissioners and its attestation by the Chief Clerk.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

Southeastern Pennsylvania Emergency Services IP Network Regional Fiber Optic Cable Interconnectivity

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Department of Transportation (PennDOT) and the counties of Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Montgomery and Philadelphia (Counties) wish to interconnect fiber optic cable for the purpose of an Emergency Services Internet Protocol Network (ESInet) to transport emergency services and transportation data.

WHEREAS, these governmental Agencies wish to foster greater public safety cooperation and coordination; and

WHEREAS, transfer of emergency services and radio interoperability data will assist the PennDOT Regional Traffic Management Center and Counties in coordinating emergency services responses and activities by increasing situational awareness of traffic conditions on highways and improving communications between responding agencies; and

WHEREAS, parties to this Intergovernmental Agreement are currently interconnected to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation District 6-0 Video Sharing Network through fiber optic cable assets provided by PennDOT and wish to expand the use of those assets by establishing policies to govern Information Technology (IT) communication, connectivity, transportation and emergency services data transfer.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties to this Intergovernmental Agreement set forth the following as the terms and conditions of their understanding:

1. Transportation data is defined as but not limited to CCTV images, travel times, travel speeds, incident information, maintenance and construction information, special events information, Dynamic Message Sign (DMS) messages, Roadway Weather Information System (RWIS) information, and other information made available to and among the participating agencies via regional fiber optic cable interconnectivity.
2. Emergency Services data is defined as but not limited to computer aided dispatch data, radio communications signals and data, radio interoperability messages and data, geographic information systems information, voice and video conferencing, telephony signals and messaging, or other voice, video, text and data in support of public safety communications.
3. Each Agency receiving the use of the interconnected fiber optic cable will be responsible for establishing firewalls and policies to protect its internal

Information Technology (IT) communication connectivity systems. To assist in establishing regional fiber interconnectivity each Agency will share IT requirements including, but not limited to, network architecture, equipment requirements, and security requirements.

4. When the fiber optic cable is modified by adding additional lines, deleting lines, or changing lines, the initiating agency will notify the other participating Agencies. Similarly, when an Agency's IT staff makes changes to its firewall or IT policy that affects regional fiber interconnectivity, the other participating Agencies shall be notified of the changes.
5. PennDOT shall be responsible for maintenance and repair of its fiber network and outside plant IT equipment used in regional fiber optic cable interconnectivity.
6. Counties shall be responsible for the implementation and maintenance of IT equipment that provides emergency services data, e.g. Routers, firewalls, multiplexers, etc.
7. Counties shall, at their own expense, install and maintain IT equipment that provides emergency services data networking at the Regional Traffic Management Center.
8. As public entities, each participating Agency shall make the utmost effort to preserve the integrity of its internal IT systems. No Agency shall be responsible for any damage or malfunction of another participating Agency IT systems due to regional fiber optic cable interconnectivity.
9. The conditions of this Intergovernmental Agreement may be modified or amended at any time. Any modification or amendment will be in the form of a supplement to this Agreement executed by all participating Agencies.
10. The term of this Intergovernmental Agreement shall continue as long as the participating agencies continue to share fiber optic cable interconnectivity. Any participating Agency can withdrawal from this Intergovernmental Agreement upon 90 days written notice to the other participating Agencies.
11. This Agreement shall hold harmless PennDOT from any liability and indemnify PennDOT from any liability.
12. Any dispute arising from this Intergovernmental Agreement shall be submitted to the office of General Counsel for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for resolution.
